evidence based guidelines

SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS

RED FLAGS

Consider the possibility of Substance Use Disorder for patients presenting with:

Lethargy/confusion Mental status changes
Depression/anxiety Acute psychosis
Uncontrolled high blood pressure Sleep disruption

Unexpected weight gain/loss Tremors, sweating, piloerection

Unusual pupillary dilation/constriction Abdominal cramping and diarrhea

Request(s) for early refills Asking for specific medications by name

INITIAL MANAGEMENT

Attend to acute medical needs first:

- Administer naloxone (Narcan) for excessive sedation (many drugs are laced with fentanyl)
 - Nalmefene IV/IM/SC can be used for longer acting antagonism if needed
- Assure adequate fluids/electrolytes, nutrition (e.g. glucose, thiamine) and airway protection
- Treat withdrawal symptoms (e.g. clonidine, ondansetron, chlordiazepoxide, etc)

For Opioid Use Disorder, consider medications to help with recovery
